The 2011 Great Rotary Duck Race Shore Patrol Needs YOU!

RACE DAY IS SATURDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2011



Similar to previous years, we need volunteers to help retrieve over 70,000 rubber ducks from the banks of the Willamette River near Alton Baker Park.

Bring family and friends to Alton Baker Park (near the DeFazio footbridge) around 10:00AM to enjoy an incredible, pancake breakfast (donations appreciated to support Mid-Valley Rotary Club).

Volunteers will meet at 11:30 near the fountain at EWEB’s River Edge Plaza (500 E. 4th Avenue). The race starts at Noon and Shore Patrol needs to make sure that no one interferes with the rubber ducks as they race down the river until the winners have floated safely into the sealed tube. Immediately after the race ends, Shore Patrol assists the Navy in collecting stragglers caught on shore by pushing them back out into the river for boaters to retrieve or netting those that boats have missed.

Patrol lasts for about an hour. Volunteers should be finished and off the bank by 2:00PM.
